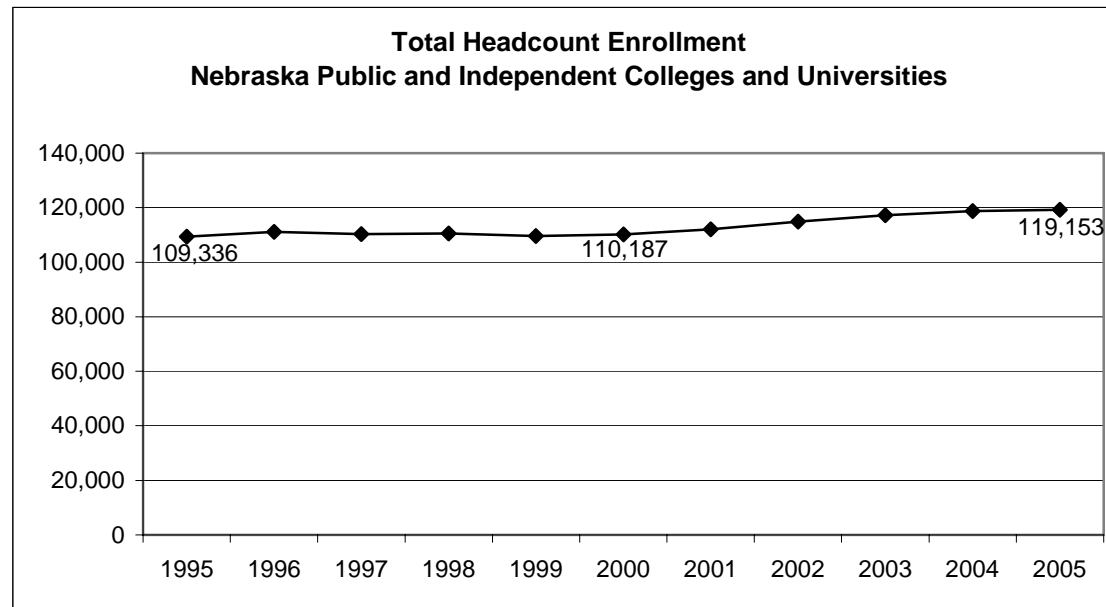

## **TOTAL HEADCOUNT ENROLLMENT: 1995-2005**

- Different rates of growth occurred in the total headcount enrollment at Nebraska's public and independent colleges and universities during the two five-year periods between fall 1995 and fall 2005.
- Total headcount enrollment increased by 0.8% between fall 1995 and fall 2000 when enrollment increased from 109,336 to 110,187.
- In comparison, total headcount enrollment increased by 8.1% between fall 2000 and fall 2005 when enrollment increased from 110,187 to 119,153 over the five-year period.

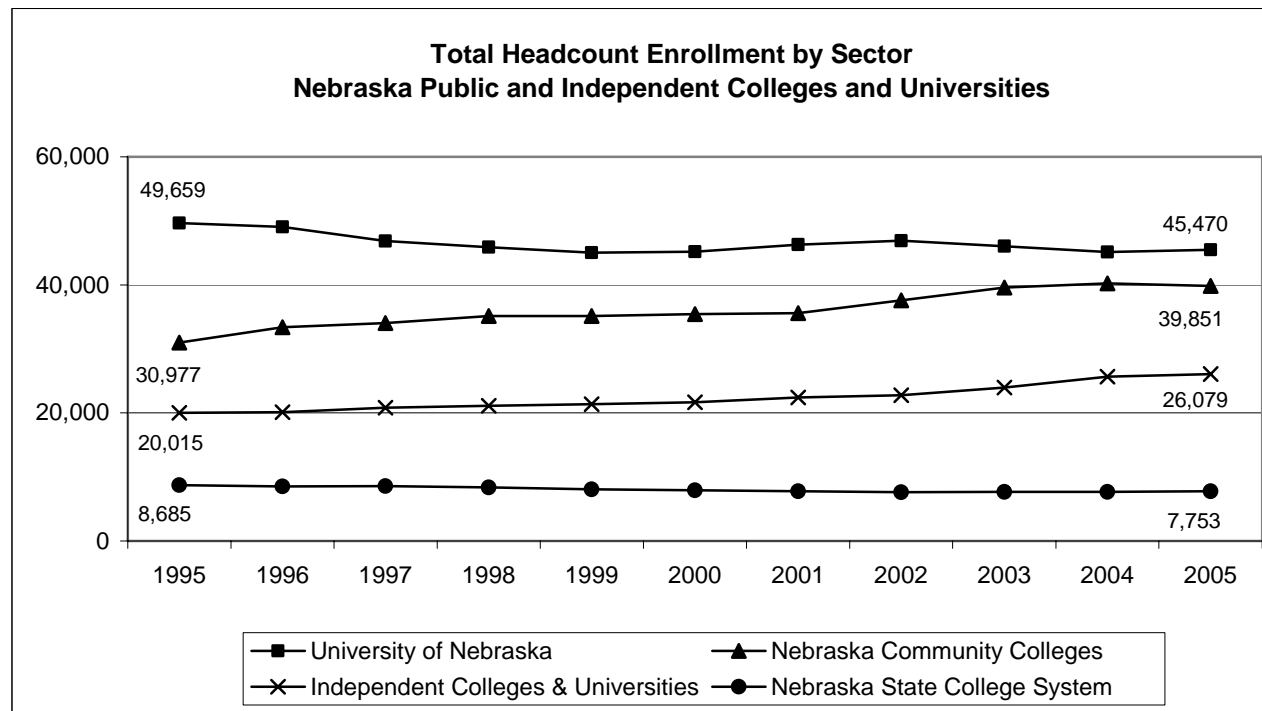

## TOTAL HEADCOUNT ENROLLMENT by SECTOR: 1995-2005

- Over the 10-year period between fall 1995 and fall 2005, Nebraska's public colleges and universities experienced the following changes in enrollment:

University of Nebraska	- 8.4%
Nebraska Community Colleges	28.6%
Nebraska State College System	-10.7%

- Between 1995 and 2005, total headcount enrollment at Nebraska's independent colleges and universities increased by 30.3%.

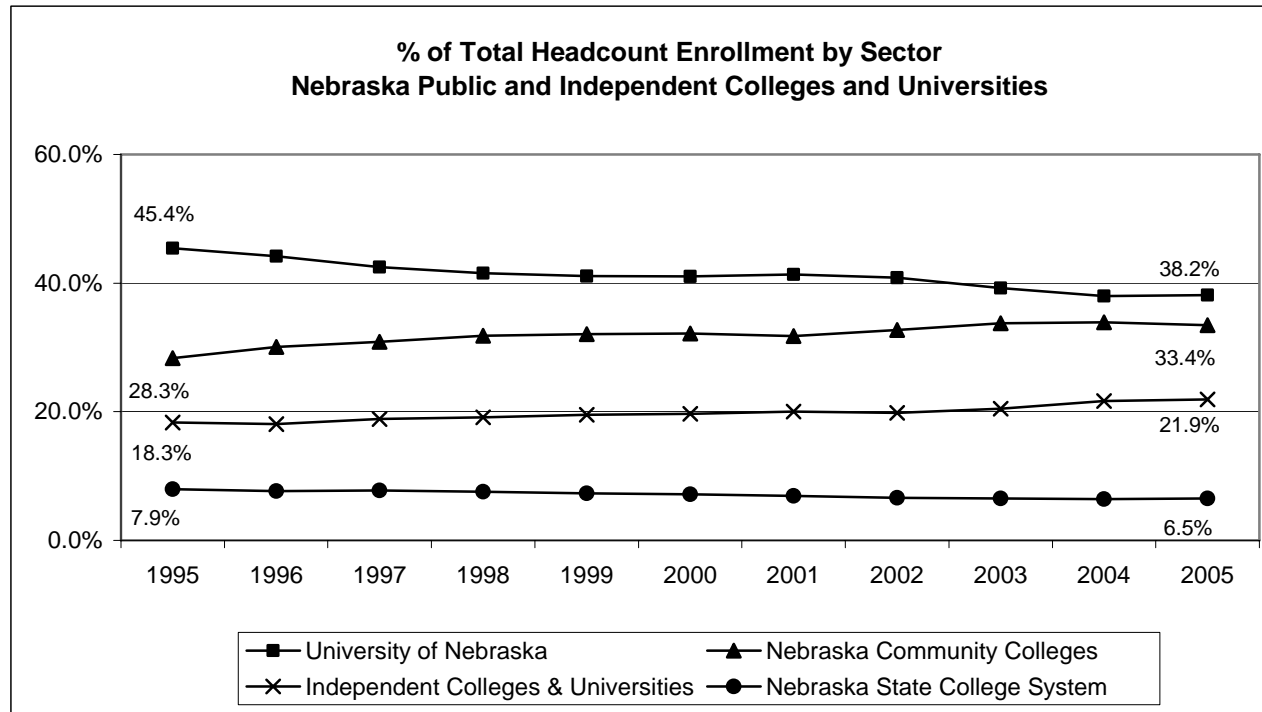

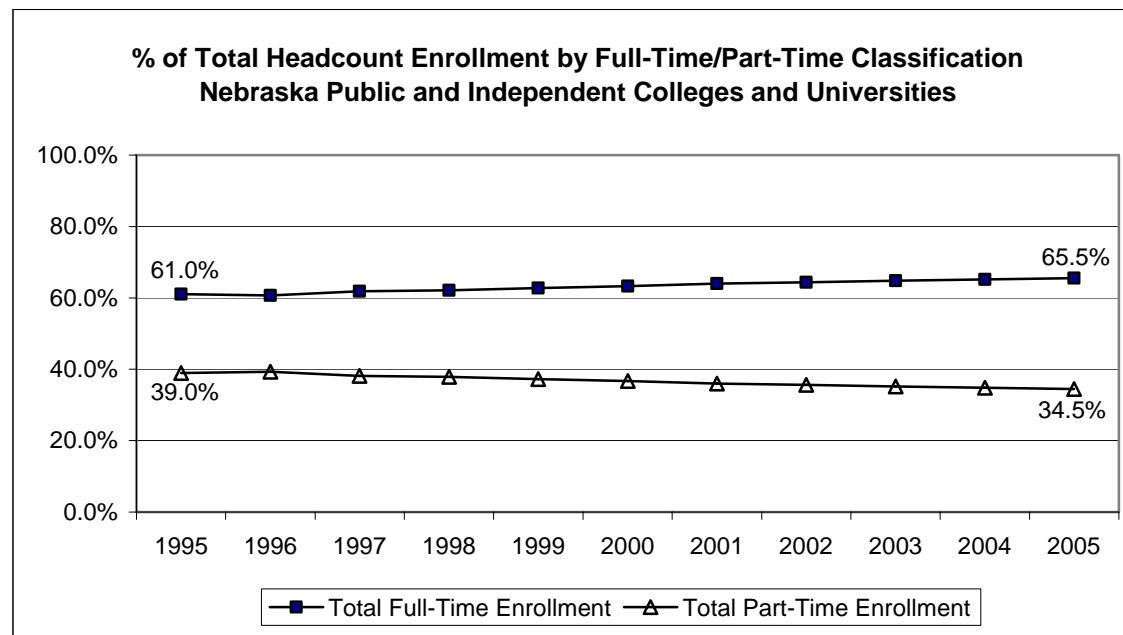
**SECTOR ENROLLMENT as a Percentage of NEBRASKA PUBLIC AND INDEPENDENT ENROLLMENT: 1995-2005**

- As a result of the enrollment changes that occurred between fall 1995 and fall 2005, the enrollments of the Nebraska's community colleges and Nebraska's independent colleges and universities accounted for higher percentages of total public and independent enrollment in 2005 than in 1995, while the University of Nebraska and Nebraska State College System enrolled smaller percentages.



## **TOTAL HEADCOUNT ENROLLMENT by FULL-TIME AND PART-TIME CLASSIFICATION: 1995-2005**

- Between fall 1995 and fall 2005, total full-time enrollment increased, while part-time enrollment decreased at Nebraska's public and independent colleges and universities.
- Full-time enrollment increased by 17.0%, from 66,711 in fall 1995 to 78,055 in fall 2005.
- Part-time enrollment decreased by 3.6%, from 42,625 in fall 1995 to 41,098 in fall 2005.
- As a result of the different rates of increase, full-time enrollment accounted for 65.5% of total enrollment by fall 2005, up from 61.0% in fall 1995.
