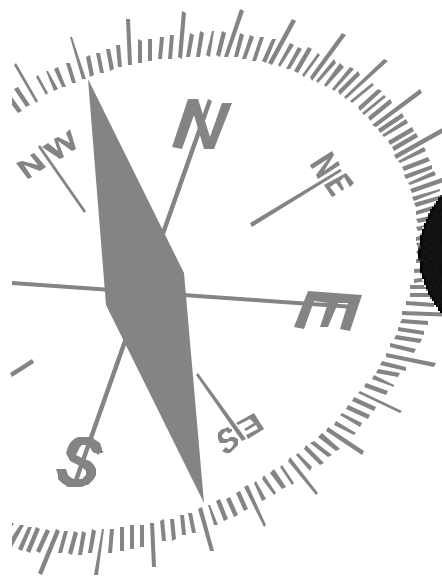
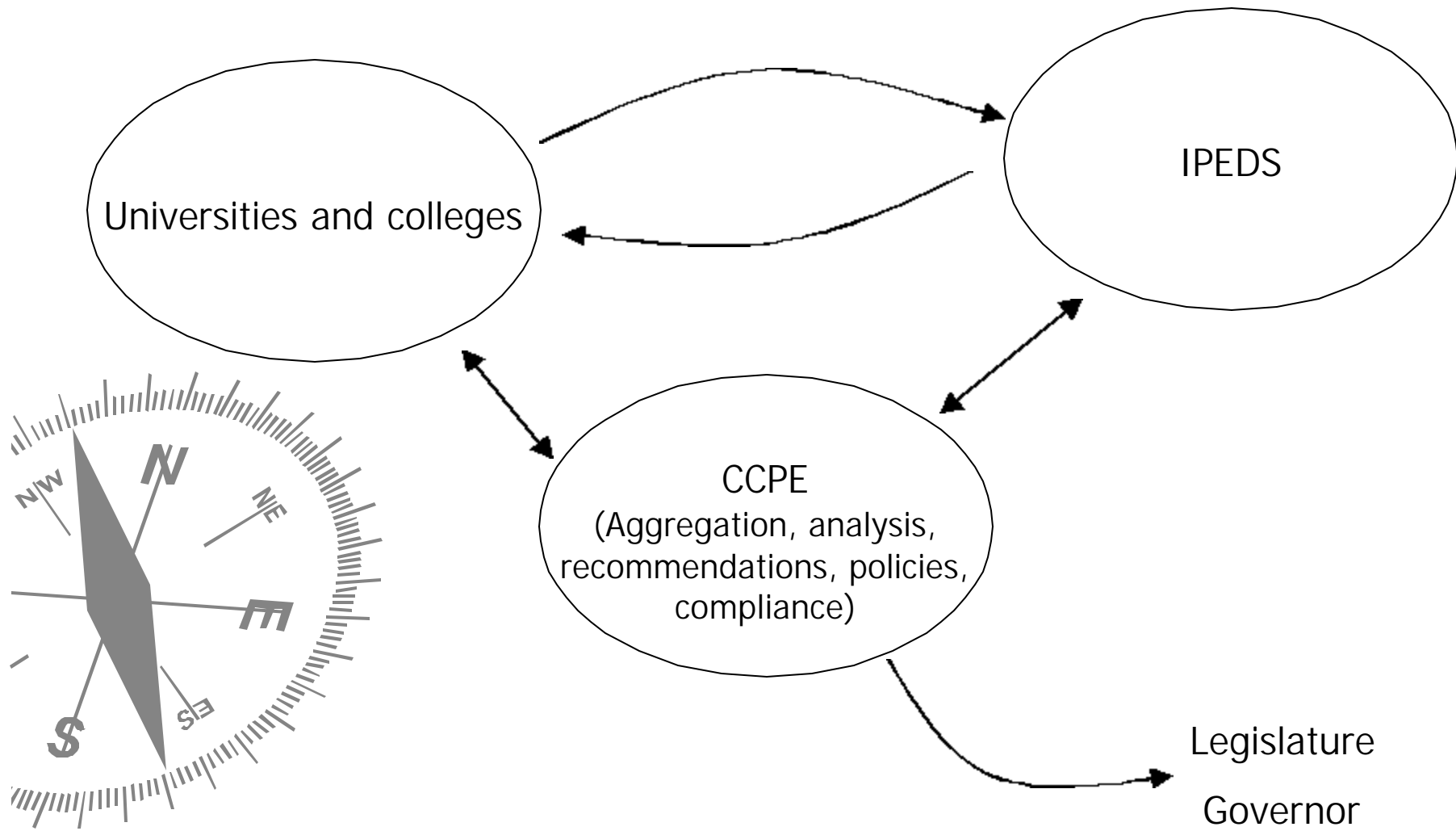

# The flow of data



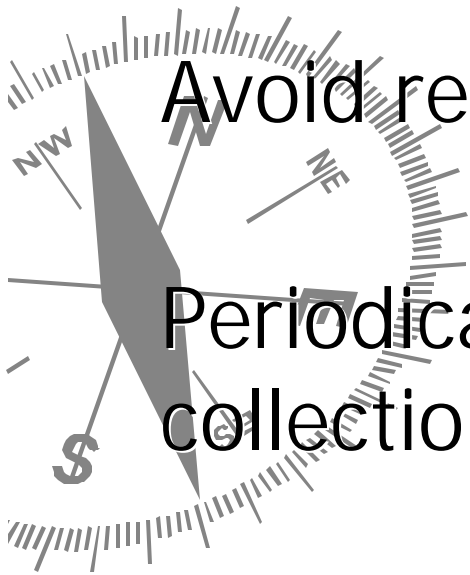
# Data guidelines

Avoid redundant submissions

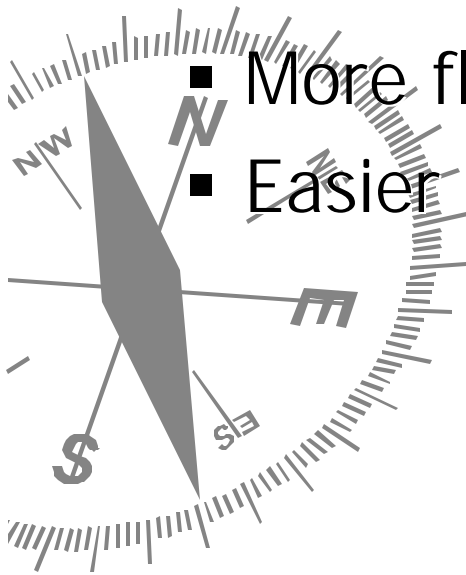
Periodically review and adjust entire data collection process

- Easier and cheaper to produce and disseminate



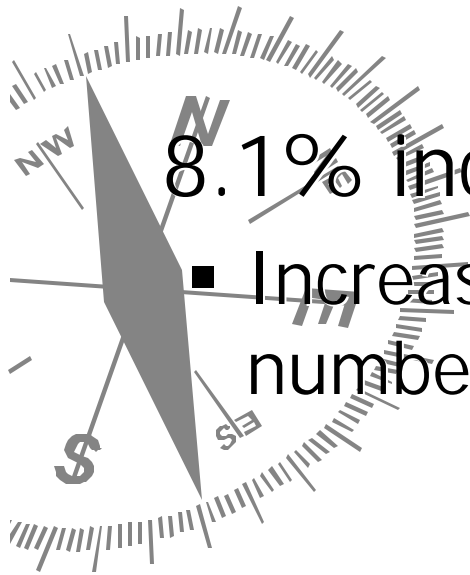

# Total headcount enrollment

Stagnant between 1995-2000

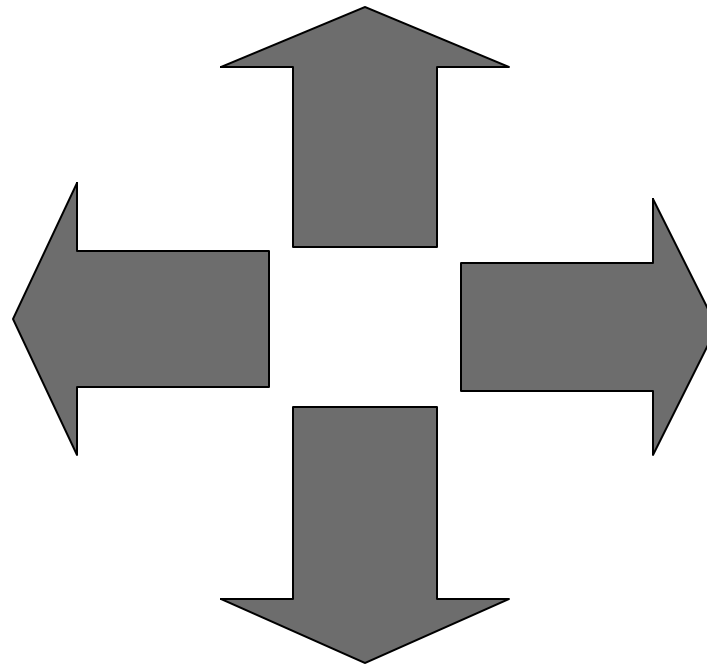
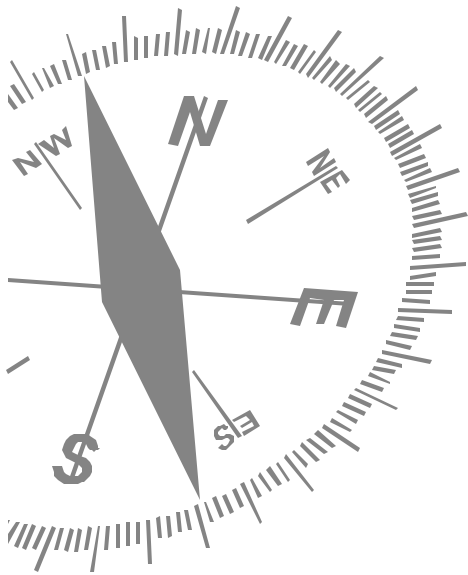
8.1% increase between 2001-05

- Increase occurred while high school graduate numbers decreased

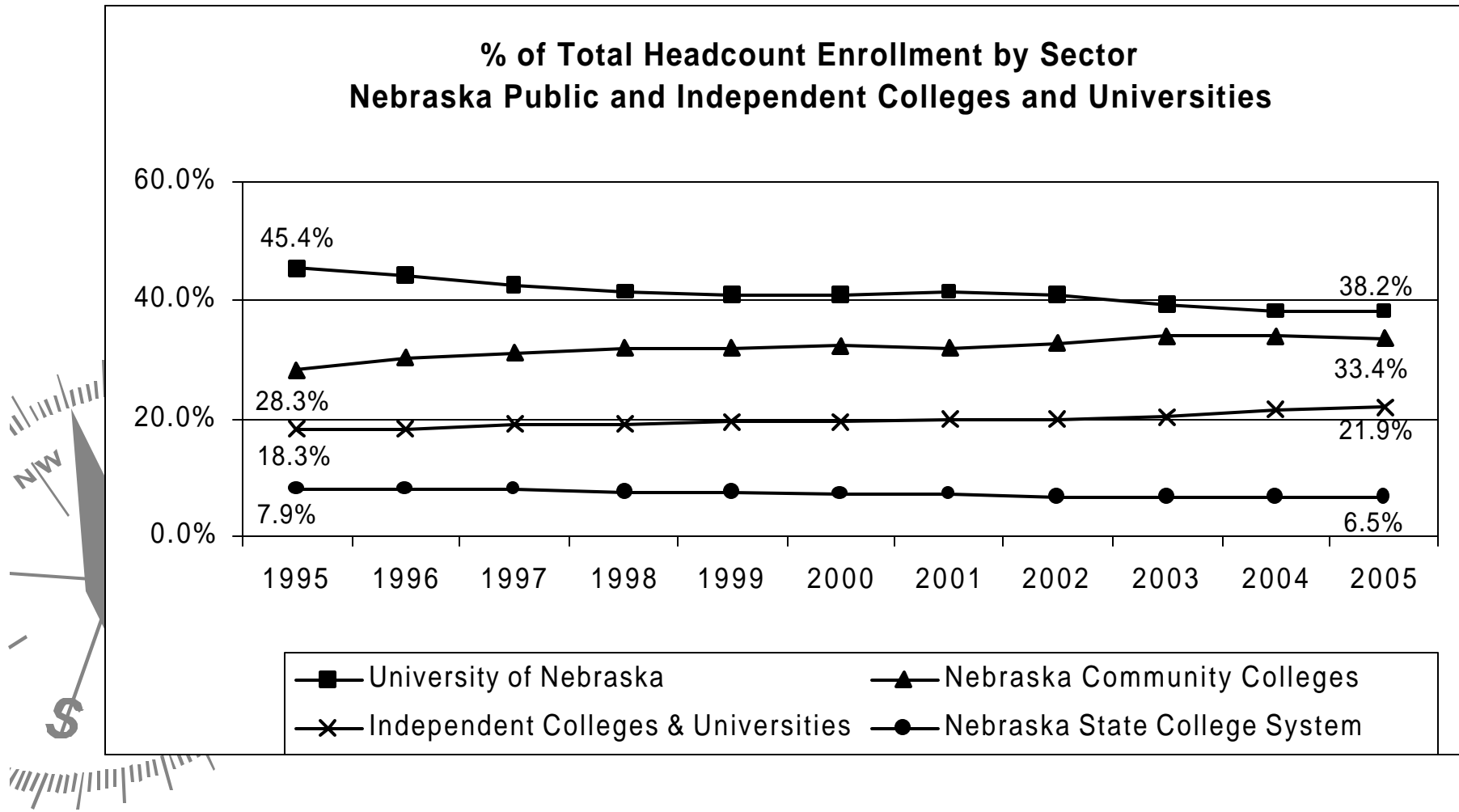


# Shifting enrollment patterns

Enrollment patterns among sectors have shifted in the past 10 years—sometimes dramatically



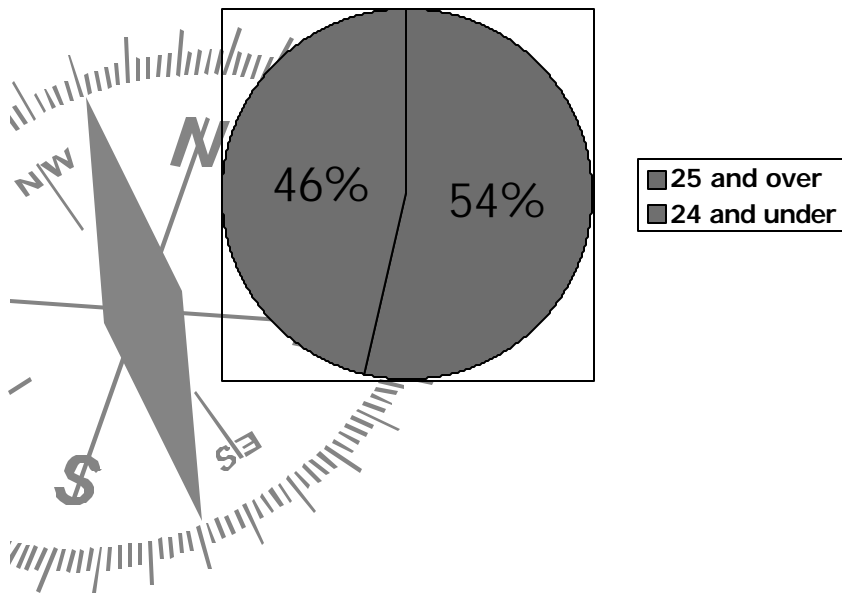
# "Market share"



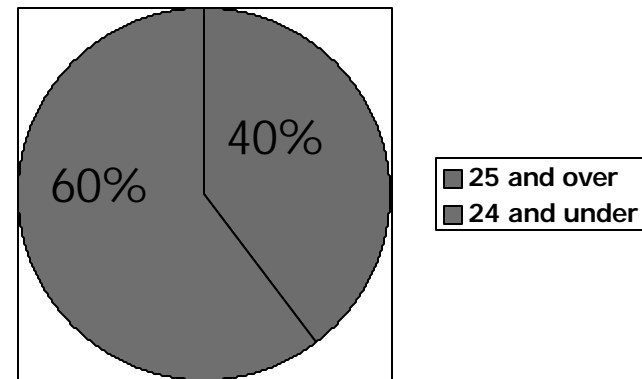
# Age distribution

1995 enrollment by age



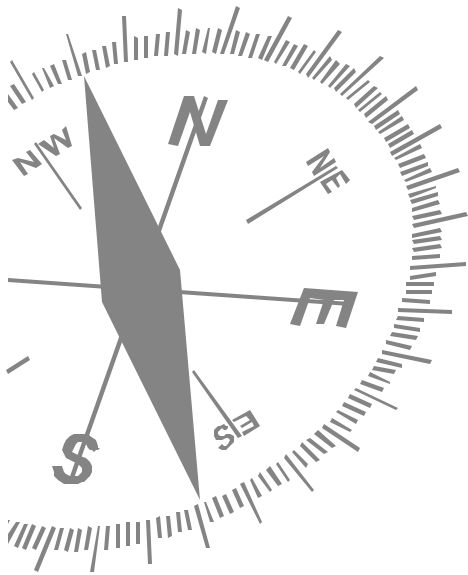
2005 enrollment by age



# Minorities

1995-2005 total enrollment increases:

- Minority: 48.5%
- Foreign student: 28.7%
- White non-Hispanic: 4.8%

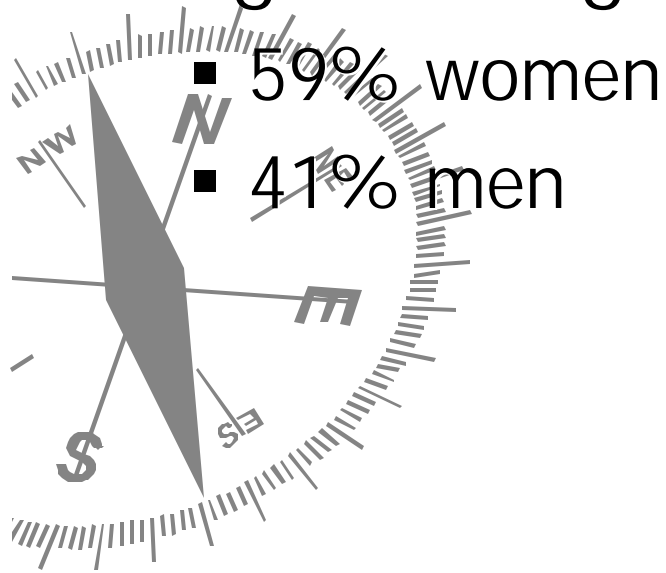


# Gender
